"Do You See Me? Black Male Students' Interactions With Counseling Faculty"

Despite historical and contemporary legislative and institutional reforms, Black male counseling students encounter a myriad of obstacles while enrolled in counselor education programs. Join this discussion of a qualitative study that investigated the experiences of 10 African American counseling students' interactions with faculty. Findings, implications, and recommendations for future research will be presented.

Dr. Brown is a Licensed Professional Counselor and National Certified Counselor and a member of the Association for Specialists in Group Work (ASGW) Special Initiative Committee. He has experience in both correctional and community settings.
