"Highlights of Activities of 2017-2018 Academic Year (200-800 words):"

In the fall semester of 2017 Mu Kappa celebrated National Geographic's annual Geography Awareness Week (November 12-18), by organizing a guest talk titled

'Climate Change and Globalization in Coastal Regions: Opportunities and Challenges for Building Resilience' by Dr. Robin Leichenko (Geography professor at Rutgers University) with a luncheon afterwards where invited students and faculty could talk with the speaker. The lecture was co-sponsored with the Department of Global Studies and Geography, and the Hofstra Cultural Center, and it was very well attended, with around 130 people in the audience, many of whom asked questions during the Q&A session following the talk.

Three student members and three faculty members of Mu Kappa presented their research at the annual AAG conference in New Orleans, April 2018.

On May 2, 2018, we organized the annual Mu Kappa initiation ceremony where 24 new members (23 students and one faculty) were initiated. The ceremony was held as a luncheon at the University Club. The event was attended by both new and old members of Mu Kappa, along with Global Studies and Geography faculty and staff. Keynote speaker, Dr. Luis Alvarez León, a Visiting Assistant Professor of Urban-Economic Geography in the Graduate School of Geography at Clark University, gave a short speech about the importance of geography as a discipline for social analysis and

change. He later gave a talk to students and faculty titled, 'From Streetscapes to Navigable Landscapes: Crowdsourcing and Contesting the Spaces of Autonomous Driving.'

Associate Professor Kari Jensen and Adjunct Assistant Professor Veronica Lippencott serve as president and vice president, respectively, of Mu Kappa, and they initiated this year's new members. Mu Kappa director of events, Assistant Professor Craig Dalton recruited the speaker for the initiation ceremony. Mu Kappa secretary and student member Rachel Scarpino designed the printed program, and introduced the initiates to the history and symbolism of Gamma Theta Upsilon at the initiation ceremony. Department administrator, Jackie Geis assisted with the logistics.

Mu Kappa secretary and student member Rachel Scarpino organized Mu Kappa's "Textbooks for Africa" donation drive. The drive became very successful, with support not only from the Department of Global Studies and Geography, but also from other schools and departments at Hofstra University. Seven boxes of books were shipped out in June to "Books for Africa" in Atlanta, GA, from where books are distributed to many different African countries.

This event promoted geography by bringing together a diverse group of students and faculty to learn about Puerto Rico from professor Zilkia Janer and student Adriana Galarza, who both have family ties to Puerto Rico, and by encouraging all attendees to donate to AAG's Hurricane Relief Fund.
