
## EMILY LOWE GALLERY Behind Emily Lowe Hall South Campus

Recognized as the "Father of Environmental Portraiture," where the background is an integral part of the image, Newman was influenced by the school of modernism. His work has contributed to the transformation of what we know as the photographic portrait; his work is found in numerous international museums and collections. ### **SUBLIME HYSTERIA:** The Art and Literature of German Expressionism

Friday, October 18, 2013 • 2-3 p.m.

Hofstra University Professor Neil H. Donahue will present an overview of the art and literature of German Expressionism. Using images and excerpts (in both German and English) he will explore the scope and intensity of the German avant-garde between 1905 and 1925, leading up to and following World War I in Germany. His talk will give participants insights into painting and poetry, drama and prose, as well as Expressionist cinema, with reflections on aesthetic and social theory. There will be ample opportunity for discussion.
