

Directions to Hofstra University: By automobile, Hofstra can be reached easily by main east-west and north-south roads. The Meadowbrook Parkway is the closest, running north and south between the Southern State Parkway and the Northern State Parkway. Exit the Meadowbrook Parkway at M4, Hempstead Turnpike. Proceed west on Hempstead Turnpike to the third traffic light; turn right onto the North Campus (just before the second pedestrian bridge that crosses Hempstead Turnpike). The Student Center is on your left; parking is just beyond the Student Center.
