- b. Welcome Russ D. Smith! Director of 1st Generation Student Support and Engagement Office
 - i. Russ: This is a fairly new office- since last October! This started originally just as a support group/committee for 1st generation students; the committee achieved a majority of our first couple goals for what we wanted to do to support first gen students. Eventually, between programming, data collection, and university-facing research, until about a year ago when I was put in charge of the First Generation office. The types of programming we do really centers around the sense of belonging. First Gen students are anyone whose parents have not received a Bachelor's degree in the U.S. The definition is broad and slightly vague to provide as much support to as many students as possible. We ensure our messages and programs have inclusive language to encourage the idea of "We," and how to achieve goals together. When things are designed for First Gen students, those students and non-First Gen students benefit.
 - ii. VP Joyal: We are really looking forward to and aiming to collaborate. Is there anything coming up soon we can be a part of?
 - 1. Russ: Not exactly first chronologically, but one of our biggest events- that SGA has been a part of in the past- is our First Gen

Student Day Attrium Takeover with tabling. That is Friday November 8th, 10am-2pm and I would love your participation. We are hosting some study/chill events to get together with others to study, listen to music, and even just color or hangout. We will also be tabling the whole week of November 8th and hoping to end that week with a movie night in collaboration with OSLE! We also host dinner once a month open to anyone, as long as you sign up on Get Involved, with special faculty guests each dinner.

- iii. Chair Mahlati: Can you give a recap of everything you post about during Welcome Week for those who were not present?
 - Russ: Sure! Our First Gen percentages are increasing- a third of our undergraduate population is first generation students. First Gen students also have lower retention rates, but we are working on efforts to make sure they get to graduation. Most of our first generation students are STEM majors. We are on track to become more and more first generation students with each class we bring in. We are one of the most "first gen" schools in the area, and we have been nationally recognized for this.
- iv. Comptroller Greenlaw: What has been your most rewarding experience in the past year?
 - Russ: There have been a couple. Typically I would say the graduation ceremony. It is great to see the students, some of which I knew as RAs, and see how much those students have flourished. I also got to speak to all the OLs during the summer for a training; one student came to me after, quite overwhelmed with emotions realizing that they did in fact belong to the first generation community, something they didn't realize prior to our conversations.
- v. Senator Callahan: How do you support students who may not have support from their own family?
 - Russ: I think, even with support, being first generation can be really isolating. For a lot of first generation students, they are the "hope" of the family, and as students learn and grow, they tend to "change" and become isolated. It is a very common experience. One way I try to help with this is by bi-weekly resources to students with my emails, offering free programs for them. What most don't know, is that I also send emails to parents. My hope is to keep parents engaged. It is harder to help students who's parents don't believe in college; my goal for those cases is to make them feel at home here through our programs.

- vi. Senator Singh: How do you feel support systems have changed since when you were a first generation student?
 - Russ: I think I am able to use my experience, as well as my research, to help students. But, I know the source of help also comes from listening to the students themselves. When I was in college, "first gen" wasn't even a thing, it wasn't talked about. Things are now named and given language for experiences we all go through but didn't talk about.
- vii. President Anniballi: Some of the challenges students face arise from the higher education institutions or social factors. What are some things that peers can do to support their first generation student friends?
 - 1. Russ: It is common to look at first generation students as lacking when it comes to the institutional perspective. That is what I am working towards, to make the space for them. As a peer, I would say to be there for them; create a safe space for first gen students to share their experiences and not feel like an outsider when doing so. We need to change the perspective so that everyone views first gen students as valuable in an educational setting. We have to make room at the table for those with different experiences.
- viii. VP Joyal: I know you mentioned tabling for "Celebrate First Gen," which made me think of our associate and electrion process, and finding a way to collaborate with your office and see how easy and accessible it is to join leadership roles.
 - 1. Russ: Maybe in April for your elections we can collaborate. We can try to co-host a dinner with you guys and make it a group effort.
- ix. Chair Young: Do you have any plans to help students feel more sure of themselves or are struggling from Imposter Syndrom?
 - 1. Russ: Most definitely. I speak every year about Imposter Syndrom, and everytime I give that speech I get the most nervous and feel inferior. So, I don't think there is ever an end to imposter syndrom, but knowing it is there and talking about it openly takes away the power it holds on us. It stops the spiral.
 - x. Senator Singh: Do you have any questions for us as students on this campus?
 - 1. Russ: I do, but it is a hard question. Students before you have applied to make a First Gen Club, and were denied based on the reasoning that there was already an office where support would fall under. Do you know why they would have been denied, as there

are other organizations that are associated with various offices on campus?

- a. President Anniballi: SGA was not opposed to the creation of a First-Gen Club and our representatives in club recognition meetings voted in support of such, but other representatives amde the ultimate decision to not recognize the organization. SGA is still in support of the creation of this organization and we will fully back the reapplication and appeal if necessary going forward. The logic that was provided does not match our values, and is not consistent with other organizations. I worked with the president of First Gen Club to ensure their emails were responded to.
- xi. Senator Miranda: Are there any peer-mentor programs?
 - 1. Russ: Yes! There are many peer-mentor tracks that we have across campus that I oversee the programs. We have 6 or so tracks, one of which is First Generation, so this is the first year we have a peer-to-peer program; we also have a faculty-to-peer program.
- xii. VP Joyal: I just want to draw your attention to some committees that may work well with your goals and future collabs – programming, equity and inclusion, wellness and campus safety, and club resources. I am sure they are all willing and ready to collab!
